A bill was presented for payment for insurance. Saw & Warn Insurance Co. for \$86.00 covering the period of 6/5/75 to 6/5/76.


There will be a convention held in Wildwood the second week of September. Anyone who wishes to take their apparatus there may do so because the apparatus will be kept in a safe place.

PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE ATLANTIC COUNTY
FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION

The following changes are recommended by the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. The Executive Committee has approved of these changes.

Article I. The name of the Association shall be changed to:
THE ATLANTIC COUNTY FIRE-FIGHTER'S ASSOCIATION OF NEW JERSEY

and that: where the word "firemen(s)" appears that it shall be changed to "fire-fighter(s)" throughout the Constitution & By-Laws.

X Article III. Add Section 5 & 6

Section 5: Any Instructor in the Fire Sciences Programs at Atlantic Community College and Stockton College may become members of the Association upon making application in writing, accompanied by the entrance fee of one (\$1.00) dollar, to the Executive Committee. Upon approval of the Executive Committee and a majority of the delegates present at a regular meeting the applicant shall receive membership with all rights and privileges of an individual member.

Section 6: The voting privileges of Atlantic Community College and Stockton College shall be limited to four (4) votes. ^{each} The Secretary of the County Association shall be advised of the voting delegates names at the beginning of each calander year. No alternates shall be allowed. See note below:

Article III Section 1: Delete the sentence: " And the Atlantic City Fire Reserves shall have one of Atlantic City's votes.

Note of explanation: The Executive Committee has determined that the Atlantic City Fire Reserves are entitled to a full company membership by virtue of their operation under Civilian Defense a governmental agency as described in the first sentence of Article III Section 1. The Executive Committee recommends that they be granted full status upon receipt of the proper entrance fee prescribed in Article III Section 2.

Note: Section 6 shall include : The fee of \$5.00 shall apply for each college the same as a fire company as described in Article III Sections 2 and 3.

These proposed changes will be introduced in October for first reading. Second reading will be in November with voting to be held in December.
