Dash Board with rear covered

Geille = no higher than headlights

Kojack light on roof

Both the 1st and 3rd loacations must be removed after incident. Allipolice cars and fire trucks will be expected to use red lights. The police will, within a year, have flashing yellow lights in the trunks. No more than 1 blue light per car. Civil Air and Rescue Groups were denied the use of the blue light.
